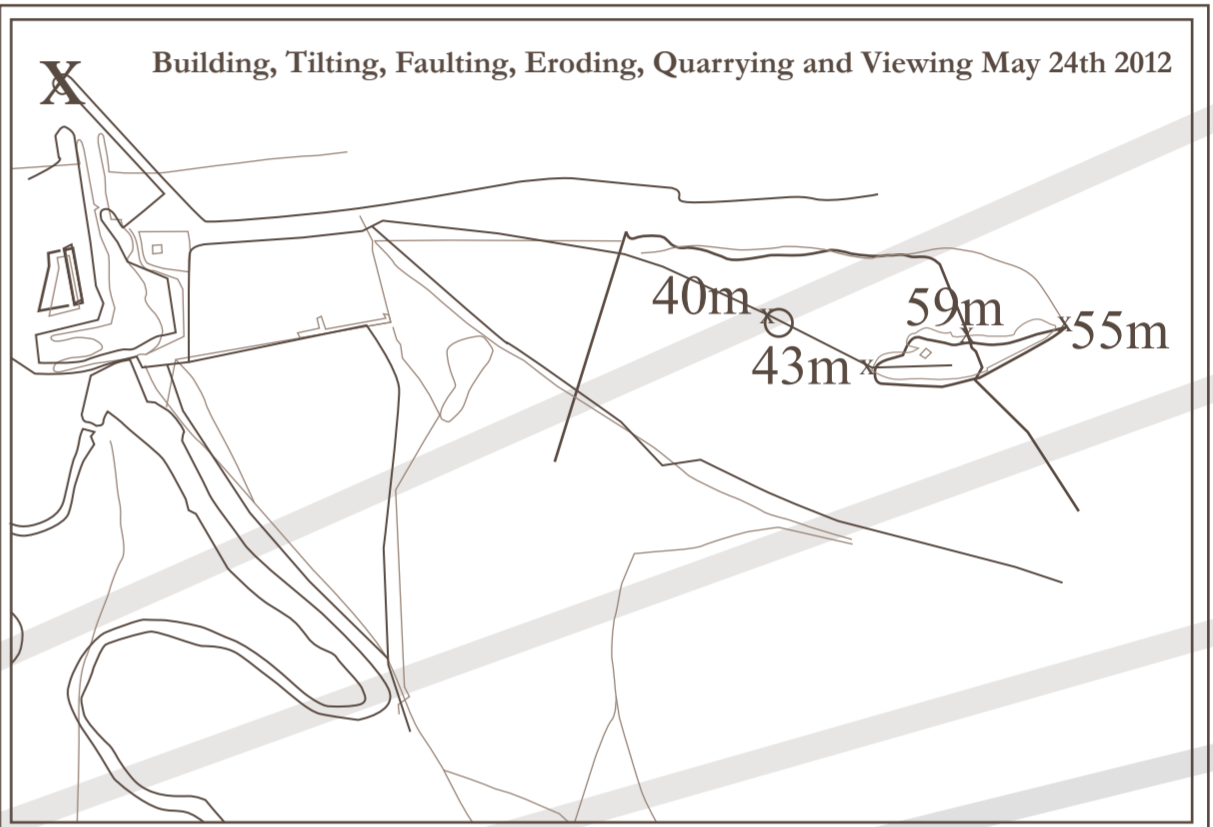

Gape - the bugle blower on the East Cliff when the 'Mackel Stayer'

Good - shipbuilding to rope, net, shingle, tobacco and brandy

Slader - rope and sailcloth

Hounsell - cordage, twine, canvas lines and net, and the first boat called Mary that sailed to Newfoundland for cod, where some settled.
